1. Call to Order

In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, this meeting was advertised in the Burlington County Times and posted in the Chatsworth Elementary School and on the District's Website.

2. Complaint Procedure:

If a problem arises, the teacher will notify the administrator. If a parent calls or comes to see the administrator, the administrator will instruct the parent to meet with the teacher. If the parent-teacher meeting does not resolve the problem, the parent can meet with the teacher and administrator. If this meeting does not resolve the problem, the parent can go to the School Board at which time the administrator and teacher may be represented. In the event, that a parent or citizen bypasses the complaint procedure; the Board will not discuss or take action on the complaint.

Public agendas are available as you enter the room. There is one full copy of the support documentation located in the binder next to the agendas. Please feel free to examine the binder, but please do not remove any items as a courtesy to other members of the public. Copies of all documents are available from the business office during regular business hours.

There will be two opportunities for public input at every Board of Education meeting. The first opportunity, titled "Public Comment on Agenda Items Only," is your opportunity to provide comments to the Board of Education, prior to the Board taking action. This opportunity is only for items that appear on the agenda.

The second opportunity, titled "Public Comment," is your opportunity to provide comment that may be of interest to the educational welfare of the district but is not restricted to agenda items only.

At no time during these public comment periods will the Board allow disparaging remarks about students, district personnel, or members of the Board of Education. In addition, the Board will not allow remarks about specific students or district personnel. If such remarks are made, the Board President will declare

Participation in the Sustainable Jersey for Schools Certification Program

Whereas—The Woodland Township Board of Education (or Board of Trustees) seeks to participate in Sustainable Jersey for Schools to focus attention and efforts on matters of sustainability and pursue initiatives that will lead to Sustainable Jersey for Schools Certification.

Whereas—The Woodland Township Board of Education and District Superintendent seek to support and work with school staff and administrators, students, and parents to ensure a safe and healthy environment for students by encouraging our school community to implement sustainable, energy-smart, eco-friendly, and cost-effective solutions.

Whereas—Extensive opportunities exist to teach students about ecological, economic and social sustainability, environmental health, and nutrition; to integrate sustainability education into classroom learning; and to support students in becoming leaders in making their schools healthier and more sustainable places.

Whereas—Many options and choices exist for schools to use resources more efficiently; to reduce, reuse, and recycle; to follow Green Building Standards for construction and major renovations; to form school partnerships; to eliminate toxic chemicals; to purchase (or produce) clean energy; and to purchase recycled paper, energy-efficient equipment and other green products to protect our global environment.

Whereas—Sustainability means using resources wisely, saving money, and reducing our impact on the environment, all of which will ensure the future health, safety, and prosperity of our children.

Whereas—The Woodland Township Board of Education commits to the formation of at least one Sustainability Leadership Team (also referred to as "Green Team"), based on the guidance of Sustainable Jersey for Schools. (See the "Create A Green Team" action. Your district "Green Team" can be designated from a pre-existing group within the district if desired.).

a. Financial Literacy - In the 8th grade rotation for Financial Literacy, we competed in the Stock Market Game online through SIFMA. This is a free program, and we had 5 teams compete. Student teams did research, bought and sold stocks, and watched the market. The term went from March-June. In the Southern NJ middle school region, all five teams from Chatsworth placed in the top 25%.

F. Food Celebrations during the School Year

- a. Starting September 2018 there will no longer be any food celebrations within the classroom that has not been approved prior to the event. We will no longer allow food to be brought in for birthday celebrations within classrooms. Room parents will work with classroom teachers to plan a Halloween Celebration, Winter Celebration, Spring Celebration and End of Year Celebration. All procedures regarding food being brought into the building will follow the same procedures as the past school year.
- b. There will be occasions where food and/or beverages will be served as part of a classroom experience, field trip, and/or celebration. Because the ingredients of these food and beverage products may be unknown to the food preparation person and/or server, a pupil with anaphylaxis to food should not consume any food products that he/she is unsure of the ingredients. The teacher will not provide, any food products that he/she is unsure of the ingredients. The teacher will provide, whenever possible, advance notice of the classroom experience, field trip, or celebration in order for the pupil to bring a food or beverage product from their home so they may participate in the activity.

Any matter which, by express provision of Federal Law, State Statute or Rule of
Court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from discussion in public;
Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive
funds from the federal government;
Any matter the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of
individual privacy;
Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions of which are
proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the
negotiation of terms and conditions with employees or representatives of employees of
the public body;
Any matter involving the purpose, lease or acquisition of real property with
public funds, the setting bank rates or investment of public funds where it could
adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed;
Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the
public provided that their disclosure could impair such protection;
Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law;
X Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public
body is or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege
to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his
ethical duties as a lawyer;
Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment,
terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance, promotion or
disciplining of any specific prospect public officer or employee or current public office
or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all individual employee
or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such
matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting;
Any deliberation of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may
result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the

suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party as a result of an act of omission for which the responding party bears responsibility;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby declares that its discussion of the aforementioned subject(s) may be made public at a time when the Board of Education Attorney advises the Board of Education that the disclosure of the discussion will not detrimentally affect any right, interest or duty of the School District or any other entity with respect to said discussion;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education, for the aforementioned reasons, hereby declares that the public is excluded from the portion of the meeting during which the above discussion shall take place and hereby directs the Board Secretary to take the appropriate action to effectuate the terms of this resolution.
